Melbourne at the moment is witnessing a revival of its reputation for producing the most creative music in Australia.

It's happening in a small but significant way at a few key venues that are attempting to put invention and creativity first and bums on seats last. The actual shape it's taking on is something of a weird form of electronic and electric music that hasn't defined itself fully yet but which is in the process of being toyed and experimented with.

The Champion Hotel has taken the initiative and now runs 'LITTLE BAND' nights, where about ten small, barely rehearsed groups of people take the stage one after the other, and, in the ten to fifteen minutes allowed them, fire up their synthesisers and other conventional and unconventional sound/music sources and attempt to put them together in some sort of cohesive form. Sometimes they hit, sometimes they miss.
